As we reflect on the accomplishments of the past year, it is with immense pride and gratitude that we share our 2022-2023 Impact Report. This report serves as a testament to Hillsborough Education Foundation's unwavering commitment to the pursuit of educational excellence in our community.

One of the standout achievements of this vear has been the launch and successful implementation of our Student Center of Post-Secondary Exploration (SCOPE) program at King High School. SCOPE has proven to be a transformative initiative, providing invaluable resources and guidance to more than 500 high school students as they navigate the path towards higher education and career readiness. We have witnessed remarkable growth in student aspirations, financial aid applications and career preparedness, reaffirming the profound impact of SCOPE.

Looking ahead, we are excited to announce our plans for expansion. Our vision for SCOPE extends beyond King High School, as we are dedicated to bringing this life-changing program to five additional Hillsborough County public high schools by 2026. This expansion will empower more students to dream big, aim high and achieve their goals.

In addition to our work in College & Career Readiness, HEF is investing in early literacy initiatives that will set our youngest learners on the path to success.

In the 2022-2023 school year, HEF kicked off our Transforming Early Literacy Initiative (TELI) with an initial investment of \$275,000. TELI will launch at 12 of our highest needs schools in the 2023-2024 school year. By improving quality instruction and enhancing early literacy skills, we aim to equip our youngest learners with the tools they need to excel academically and in life.

Furthermore, recognizing the pressing need in our community, we are proud to announce the opening of our Teaching Tools Resource Center to all Hillsborough County Public Schools, not just Title I schools. By broadening access to essential educational resources, we hope to level the playing field and ensure every student has the opportunity to thrive.

None of these achievements would be possible without the dedication and support of our community, and we extend our heartfelt gratitude to each of you. Together, we are shaping a brighter future for the students of Hillsborough County.




College & Career Centers

In the 2022-23 school year, HEF opened our first on-site college and career **center** at King High School, the Student Center of Post-Secondary Exploration (SCOPE). Through SCOPE, we empower students through one-on-one coaching and support with postsecondary planning.

In our first year of operation, **557 students — nearly half of King High's population —** were impacted by SCOPE through individualized meetings and workshops.




Teacher Development, Support & Recognition


