Florida high school students have the opportunity to earn Florida Bright Futures Scholarships to help pay for college
expenses. Community service hours and/or paid work hours are needed to be eligible for every level of the Florida Bright
Futures scholarship. Start investigating where you would like to serve the community and/or work a paid part-time job
while in high school. Community service and/or paid work hours are needed for every level of Florida Bright Futures
scholarships. Community services hours requirements are 30 hours are required for Gold Seal, 75 hours are required for
the Medallion level, and 100 hours are required for the Academic Scholar level. If a student selects to use paid work
hours or a combination of community service and paid work hours then the requirement is 100 hours total for each level
of Bright Futures (Academic Scholar, Medallion, and Gold Seal levels). Not required in middle school, but some students
begin volunteering in seventh and eighth grades.
